## Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010

## **Proposed Outline of Guide for Directors and Officers**

This guide will outline the duties and obligations of directors and officers under the new Not-for-Profit Corporation's Act, 2010 (ONCA). Below, for your input, are the proposed topics to be included in the guide for directors and officers.

- 9. What are the powers and duties of a director/officer?
- 10. How many directors are required to be on the board of directors?
- 11. What is a director's term of office? (i.e. is set out in by-laws or statutory maximum set by ONCA is four years)
- 12. What is an officer's term of office?
- 13. What are the key potential liabilities of directors and officers?
- <u>14.</u> To whom does a director or officer owe his or her duties? Does it matter whether the director is appointed by virtue of his or her office in another organization or is appointed or elected by a particular subset of the members?
